Every Tuesday, I go to breakfast with friends, most of whom were drivers too. I like Bible study once a week and my daughter, Janice, visits often," George shares. "I take things day by day. George just turned 100! His family, friends, and the team at Welsh Mountain celebrated his birthday, his friendly spirit, and the respect with which he treats all people.
